More on the Self-Assessment Process in South River...

.....
As you may be aware of the District of South River will be entering the second half of the Self-Assessment Process this year. During this school year, the State Monitoring Team from the N.J. Dept. of Special Education will be in residence with in the South River Public Schools for one week to complete their assessment of the Special Education Department. During this time they will review the district's compliance with special education laws and policies and once again, there will be a public forum meeting. This public forum meeting will be run by the N.J. Dept. of Special Education not by the school district. They will be asking you to comment on all aspects of dealings with the Dept. of Special Education in the course of your child's education while enrolled in the South River Public Schools system. It is very important that you, as a parent and advocate for your child's education, attend and give voice to you and your child's experiences. Your child's educational goals and achievements start with your involvement in their education. Remember you have the right to (1) ask questions, (2) it is important that you as your child's advocate participate in your child's annual I.E.P. meetings, and (3) stay in contact with everyone who is involved with your child's education. You may think that you do not have the time but it is your child's educational growth (or lack of it) that ultimately pays the price in the end. There are many organizations throughout
